Solitaire can be played alone or as a group using 1 deck of cards without Jokers.
The object is to gather 4 stacks of cards from Ace to King.

## PREPARE TO PLAY:

$\star$ Deal I card face-up, followed by $\mathbf{6}$ cards face-down in a row to the right of it.

* Then place 1 card face-up on the 2 nd pile in the row, followed
 by 1 card face-down on each of the 5 cards to the right. Continue this pattern until the last pile in the row has 1 face-up card on top of it.
$\star$ Place the leftover cards in a stockpile.


## GAME RULES:

* Look at the board. If there are any face-up Aces, move them to the space above the row and turn over the card it was covering.
* When no Aces are showing, you can remove any face-up card from one pile and place it on top of a face-up card that's I less than and a different color than the card that's moving.
$\star$ This will leave a pile with a card face-down. Turn over that card and place it back on top of its pile.
$\star$ Continue moving cards.
$\star$ As cards pile up, you can move entire stacks of face-up cards whose highest card is I less than and a different color from the lowest face-up card on another stack.

$\star$ Once you have made all possible moves, count out $\mathbf{3}$ stock cards stacking them face-up. You must use the top card of each 3-card set before trying to use the next card beneath it, and so on. They can:
a) Put this card on its matching-suit Ace pile up top, if it is the next number needed counting up
b) Put this card on one of the face-up cards in the row if it's the other color and the next number needed when counting down
c) If you can't use the card, create a discard pile and flip the next set of 3 cards from the stock.
$\star$ When you have an empty space in your row of 7 cards, put any available King there, otherwise leave the space empty.
$\star$ Continue counting out cards by 3 until you reach the end of the stock. Then turn the discard pile over to create a new stock, and restart by taking a new set of 3 cards.
* The game is over when all cards are up top, from Ace to King.
